Dr. Bryant is board certified in orthopaedic surgery, and specializes in the treatment of all musculoskeletal problems affecting bones, cartilage, joints, muscles, tendons and ligaments.



Dr. Steven L. Buckley is certified by the American Board of Orthopaedic Surgeons, and specializes in pediatric orthopaedics. His areas of expertise include scoliosis, cerebral palsy, spina bifida, sports injuries, fractures, clubfoot deformity, hip dysplasia, and limb length discrepancy.



Dr. Michael W. Cantrell is board certified in orthopaedic surgery and specializes in arthroscopic and open reconstruction, and joint replacement. Dr. Cantrell is a United States Olympic Committee Physician.



Dr. Andrew Cappucino is board certified in spinal surgery and orthopaedic surgery. His background consists of an undergraduate education in biomedical engineering at John Hopkins University, a residency in Orthopedic Surgery at the University of Buffalo medical school, then a return to John Hopkins to complete specialty training in spine surgery. He has served on the medical staff of the Buffalo Bills for many years, and was recently selected as Western New York's "Health Care Hero 2005" for his contributions as an innovator of medical technology.



Dr. Brian R. Carter is board certified in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation. He specializes in the diagnosis and non-surgical treatment of soft tissue, neuromuscular and musculoskeletal disorders.



Dr. Joe Clark Hand is board certified in orthopaedic surgery. He is dedicated to relieving people from the pain of hand problems, including carpal tunnel syndrome, wrist pain and arthritis.



Dr. Stanton B. Davis is board certified in orthopaedic surgery and sports medicine. He has a special interest in shoulder and knee surgery with advanced training in arthroscopic labral and rotator cuff repairs of the shoulder, knee ligament reconstruction and cartilage transplantation.
